


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Starting kindergarten is an exciting milestone for you and your child! Thinking about speech, language, hearing and literacy development is an important part of getting ready for school.

- · are understood by others when talking,
- speak in complete sentences,
- have conversations.
- ask questions,
- follow directions about things they cannot see,
- play co-operatively with other children,
- join in when being read to and notice words in books and the environment.



- does not turn towards or respond to sounds,
- often turns up the volume,
- frequently asks you to repeat yourself.
